BAGHDAD BUSINESS SCHOOL: ADDRESSING IRAQ'S BIGGEST CHALLENGES

Looking at Iraq today, some may see only insurmountable problems ranging from governance to the economy to the environment, with no clear path to a better future. But there is hope. Iraq has a massive untapped resource that could play a pivotal role in turning the country around, if it can be unleashed: Its youth.

Boasting one of the world's youngest populations, with one-third between the ages of 15 and 29, some claim Iraq has a demographic problem. We see it as a solution, if the untapped resource can be developed, unleashed and nurtured, to propel Iraq's development.

However, to do so requires a different approach to higher education-one that can provide Iraqi youth with the skills they need in today's economy. In fact, lack of talent is one of the biggest factors holding back the business sector in Iraq. Companies can't grow and fill entry-level positions because candidates lack necessary skill sets. To connect with an increasingly globalized world market, candidates need solid English skills. To effectively build vital relationships with customers, they need good communication skills. To solve problems and tap into new opportunities, they need critical thinking and analytical abilities. To integrate into the modern business environment, they need hard skills in tech and finance.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Baghdad Business School (BBS) is an independent, non-profit leader in providing high-quality education and employment training for young Iraqi women and men, preparing them to build successful careers in the private sector or start their own businesses.

BBS offers a one-year certificate-granting Business Foundations Program in English language, business, and soft and professional skills that prepares Iraqi youth to succeed in the private sector. Through a blended, hybrid approach, experienced international and Iraqi faculty use progressive, student-centered pedagogy that gives students the skills they need to find and even create their own opportunities. We connect our students with internships and job opportunities through our career development program, which offers weekly networking, training, and mentorship programs. Our first cohort graduated in 2021, with December 100% of finding graduates or creating employment. Three graduates launched their own businesses, one in solar energy, and the others landed jobs, including with top startups and SMEs such as Miswaq, Sagerlabs, and Earthlink, Cohort 2 will graduate and enter the job market in December 2022



BBS helped me to improve my English, communication, and problem solving skills which are required by most companies. In addition, we took an introduction to the marketing course which enhanced my knowledge and helped me to get into the marketing team at Miswag. BBS is currently recruiting for Cohort 3 which will double the current class size to around 50 students for the 2022-2023 academic year. We will continue to admit at least 40% women students to the program (Cohort 1: 40%: Cohort 2: 50%). In Fall 2022, BBS plans to pilot a new Digital Entrepreneurship curriculum to students with provide our entrepreneurship. digital strategy. business analytics, and innovation and design thinking skills. These courses will give BBS graduates much-needed skills to support the growth of the digital economy. In 2023, BBS plans to offer some of its programming to non-BBS students to enable and empower more Iragi vouth. We are also planning for a two-vear business program beginning in 2023.

FUTURE GROWTH

As we **increase our enrollment and expand our programs**, BBS is moving into our own dedicated space in October 2022 as we prepare to enroll the third class. We are expanding our faculty to accommodate the larger number of students, and to **teach new subjects that fill the skill gap**. Hiring additional staff for key functions such as recruitment and retention, career development, and student support will enable BBS to **build our institutional capacity and provide a broader range of services to students**. We will **strengthen our programming for women students** to ensure we recruit, retain, and launch more women into private sector careers. As part of our long-term strategy, BBS will establish an endowment to build for the future.

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CAPACITY AND LEADERSHIP

BBS is the flagship program of the **Baghdad Foundation for Business** Management (BFBM), a non-governmental organization established and registered in Iraq in July 2021 to enhance the training and development of Iragi youth. BFBM is led by a board of directors with experience in education, entrepreneurship, and the private sector domestically, regionally, and internationally. The Board guides BBS on key strategic decision making, provides input for programming Iraqi government activities. and ensures compliance with requirements. We also benefit from our partnership with the Iraq Fund for Higher Education (IFHE), a U.S.-registered, tax-exempt 501(c)(3) foundation that provides oversight and fundraising support. IFHÉ board members have a broad range of experiences in Iraq and the region, and bring with them skills in administration, higher education, business, entrepreneurship, and local investment.

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SUPPORT BBS

As a non-profit entity, BBS relies upon donations from the private sector, individuals, organizations, and governments to sustain and grow our programs. 
